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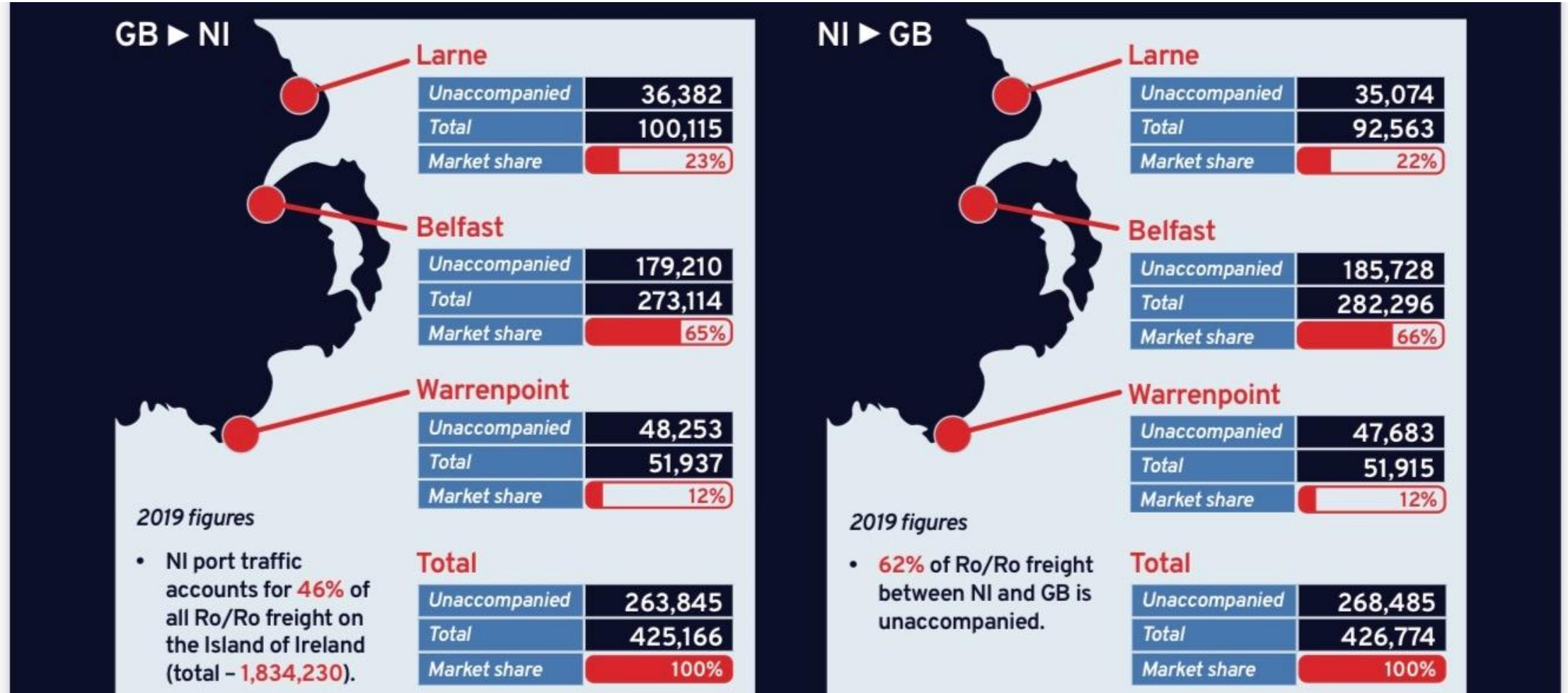

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RoRo volumes between GB and NI



Getting your goods into NI

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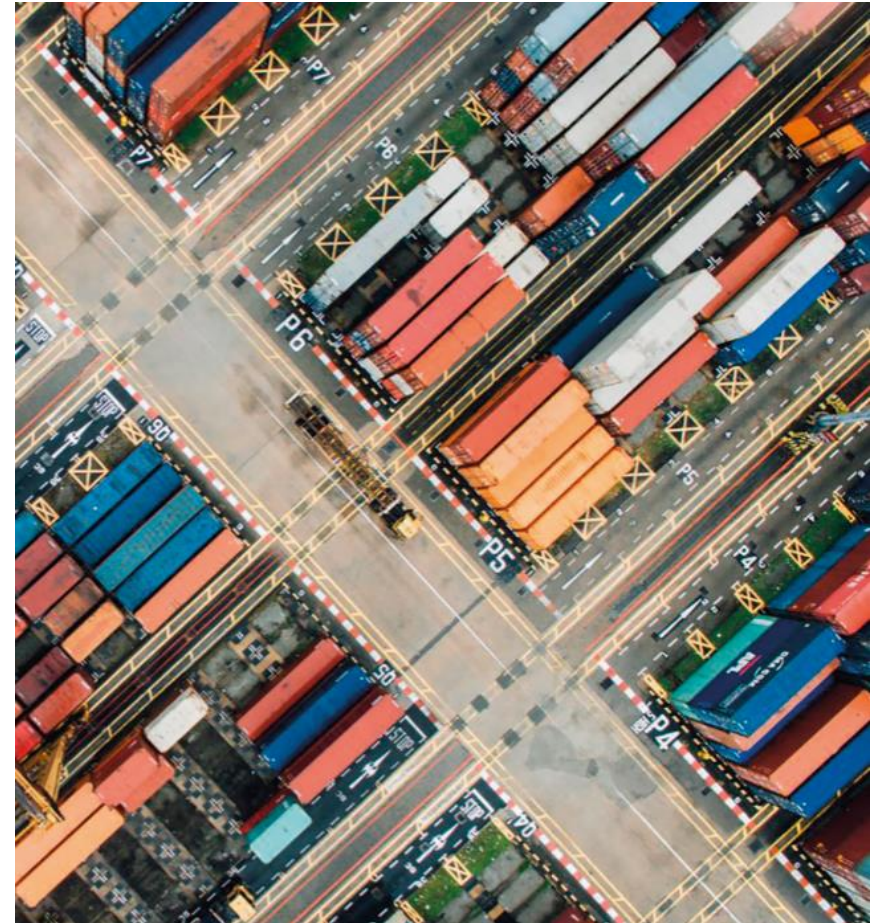
GB to NI:

You will need to provide information such as:

- Goods description or commodity code
- Consignor and consignee
- Type, amount and packaging of your goods
- Mode of transport at the border
- Onward journey details
- Export Health Certificate for products of plant and animal origin

EU to NI:

- ROI to NI – No change
- EU to NI via GB – Transit Accompanying Document (TAD)
- EU to NI avoiding GB – No change



GB to NI – GVMS to be used from 1st January

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Haulier/Intermediary

Generate a Goods Movement Reference (GMR) for each vehicle from within the Goods Vehicle Movement Service and populate this with unique reference details for all customs declarations:

- Export (containing S&S information)
- CTC Transit

For RoRo, await Permission to Progress to proceed to the port of departure.

Carrier / Location

Validate GMR

Trigger re-arrival process and automated departure

Independently capture the vehicle registration number/trailer registration number

HMG

Receive notification that goods have departed

Entry Summary Declarations *Carrier responsibility with the Haulier*

The data required will need to be provided by the “carrier” which is defined as:

- For Unaccompanied goods – shipping or Air Freight operator
- For Accompanied goods – haulier

You will need to provide information such as:

- goods description or commodity code
- consignor and consignee
- type, amount and packaging of your goods
- mode of transport at the border
- onward journey details

You can make the declaration yourself or appoint a third party such as Trader Support Service (TSS), intermediary or customs agent

Below are some examples of preparations that can be taken now:

- Apply for an EORI starting GB if required
- Decide how safety & security declarations will be made i.e. TSS /agent/ intermediary/self
- Apply for Government Gateway account if not already got one for GVMS and ICS
- Software review to use GVMS
- Implement systems on how the MRN or EORI will be obtained from the declarant to add to the GMR generated by GVMS
- Implement systems to determine how GMR and TAD (if using transit) documentation will be provided to the driver
- Commercial agreements review
- Contingency planning if driver has problems at Port



Belfast Border Control Post (BCP)

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Review supply chain, commercial agreements and Incoterms to determine if they need revising – who does what and is it reflected in the incoterms.



Review routing to establish path of least resistance - that will help determine what is required to adopt for declarations and moving goods between GB-NI and EU-NI
