


# Coronavirus Logistics Impact Survey: 11 May 2020

FTA's weekly Coronavirus Logistics Impact Survey focuses on identifying how operators and purchasers of logistics transport services are dealing with the coronavirus pandemic.

This eighth survey, conducted between 5 and 7 May 2020, had around **300** respondents spanning over **18** sectors in the UK – **46%** were small businesses with less than 50 employees, while **over one-quarter** were large businesses with more than 250 staff. **64%** were operators of logistics transport services, with **30%** consisting of both operators and users of logistics transport services.














