FTA Logistics Report

The FTA Logistics Report analyses and explores how logistics is performing on key measures and the events and trends currently shaping it. The report also contains the findings of our annual Logistics Industry Survey, which gathers views from businesses engaged in logistics in both the UK and globally.



Road freight activity

36%

increased domestic road freight

16%

increased the number of journeys to storage hubs

17%

increased the number of journeys to distribution centres



Sea freight activity

Export activity was strongest in Western Europe, Eastern Europe, and Scandinavia with sentiment indices above 67

Imports from Africa, Middle East and Western Europe declined significantly with indices below 50, indicating negative growth



Rail freight activity

Domestic bulk and semi-bulk rail freight sentiment index was 85

Domestic intermodal services sentiment index was 66.7



Air freight activity

Air freight export activity was robust in Western Europe, Far East and Middle East with sentiment indices above 70

Import activity was highest for North America with a sentiment index of 59.1

Meetings and webinars

Over 300 logistics managers and leaders attend FTA's Freight Councils every quarter.

Regional Freight Councils meet in 13 locations across the UK. There are also Air, Road, Rail and Water Councils that all members can join, as well as Shippers Council for cargo owners (retailers, manufacturers and wholesalers), a Strategic Council to address long-term issues, and a further 10 working groups focusing on more detailed logistics issues, such as customs, environmental footprint and access to skills.

These are complemented by regular Webinars and web-meetings to provide information and gather member views on fast-moving issues.

Representation



Engagement with policy makers

Access to government:

On average, each quarter the FTA Policy Team engages with 178 members of government. This includes:

- At least 10 senior officials (eq. Secretaries of States).
- Almost 80 government departmental officials.
- 34 government agencies and a further 47 local governments.
- Around 10 Members of Parliament.
- Approximately 15 policy makers and officials from regulatory agencies at global and European level.

Air, Road, Rail, Water: FTA participates in senior level industrygovernment groups across all modes.

Customs and Trade: FTA is a key part of government advisory groups on borders, customs, UK trade policy and agreements and Brexit.

Cargo Security: FTA staff have security clearance and participate in specialist security committees.

Influencing the EU: FTA is represented at the highest levels of EU logistics policy through its office in Brussels, European Commission advisory groups and trade bodies such as the European Logistics Platform.

Global influence: Global Shippers Forum provides cargo owners with representation with UN agencies such as IMO and ICAO responsible for regulating maritime transport and aviation at global level.

We work with governments and stakeholders to influence how you are able to do business, including taxes and spending, rules and regulations, and fair enforcement.

We work in regulatory areas that directly impact on logistics buyers' businesses including all modes of transport, trade procedures and security, at both national and international levels.



Representation

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Membership of FTA has given me access to the Shippers' Council and the Customs Working Group. The Shippers' Council is comprised of logistics specialists from cargo owning importers and exporters and it provides a 'safe' place to discuss pertinent issues of the day and influence policy issues at a UK and international level. Brexit is just one example of this: the FTA team has worked tirelessly to help importers and exporters understand the potential new requirements, identifying gaps in processes. working closely with government officials and traders to support continued trading. If you are a shipper of goods, whether importing or exporting, and you want to keep abreast of topical issues, I highly recommend joining FTA and the Shippers' Council.

Policy wins

These include:

- Measures that help contain transport costs, such as Fuel Duty frozen for 10 years.
- Making the case for a third runway at Heathrow while retaining early morning flights.
- Successful introduction of an alternative method to verify the gross mass of containers, avoiding the cost of individually weighing each loaded container.
- Persuaded government not to act on rail freight's use of red diesel, keeping transport costs lower.
- Encouraging a business-friendly approach to Clean Air Zones to minimise disruptions to high street deliveries.
- Supporting schemes to make it easier for buyers to identify compliant operators.
- Campaigning for improving skills in the sector and reducing staff shortages to improve transport efficiency.
- Development and promotion of key performance indicators for maritime transport and aviation, reflecting buyers' needs and driving improvements.
- Leading the effort towards digitalisation of freight documents, which will generate cost savings and simplifications for buyers.
- Simpler and clearer procedures for importers and exporters after Brexit – including significant easements for UK importers.
