# Minutes of the meeting held on 09 February at Marriott County Hall

# ROAD/23/01 Chair's Welcome

Apologies were received and noted.

#### ROAD/23/02 Meeting conduct and competition law compliance

Council was directed to the relevant page in the Policy Report.

#### ROAD/23/03 Minutes and matters arising

The minutes of the meeting held on 3 November were adopted. There were no matters arising.

# ROAD/23/04 Council Elections

#### Chair

James Adcroft from Tesco was elected as Chair, from following meeting, for a period of two years.

#### **Vice Chairs**

Bob Sands (Prompt Training); Kevin Barcroft (CMS Supatrak); David Brown (MRCT) were elected as Vice Chairs.

# **Guest Speaker** Richard Turfitt – Senior Traffic Commissioner

STC described to members the role of STC, the skills required to be a Traffic Commissioner and recalled that the job is outlined in the published Statutory Documents, which are not designed to be an absolute guide, but which set out the parameters within which they work. TCs need to be able to respond to changes in law, due to appeals, but warned by appeals from complicated cases sometimes makes for bad law.

Operators should not look to OTC for all answers, but should seek advice from others, i.e. Logistics UK MAC.

Questions relate to continuation of the restricted licence; quality of maintenance service providers; Statutory Documents consultation and 'first use inspections' (STC says this will be amended); greater number of incentives for compliant operators.

Members also held a discussion on the acute shortage of technicians and how this posed a serious threat to viability of the sector. This role is on Shortage Occupation List and some members are looking to South Africa, but more training needs to be undertaken domestically.

#### ROAD/23/05 Personnel update and Secretary's Report

Members were updated on new policy team following extensive period of recruitment.

There was also updates on Generation Logistics; Drivers Hours review; TfL Direct Vision Standard; Driver CPC review; Budget submission; Transport Select Committee's inquiry into RIS; MOT Test extension consultation.

# ROAD/23/06 Retained EU Law Bill – discussion with the Department for Transport

Members were updated on passage of Bill through Parliament and on its potential impact to the logistics sector, given the European origin of many rules governing logistics.

DfT informed members a new Brexit Opportunities Department has been established in the reformed Department for Business and it will contact David Wells to consult.

The Bill contains potential for changes to legislation up to 2026, rather than end of 2023, should a Minister decide to extend sunset clause.

Members requested to see the list of laws affected, to sense check them to see if anything was missing or required sun setting. Members raised concerns that government officials might not understand what is important to industry and could allow something to change that could cause serious harm to the sector.

Members would be keen to hear from officials in the new Brexit Opportunities Department at a following Road Council.

#### ROAD/23/07 Trailer registration

Members were given an overview of what regional Councils discussed. The position of Logistics UK could still be changed in future, but the status quo of no trailer registration scheme remains the current policy position.

### **ROAD/23/08** Decarbonisation – Transitional Technologies

Members discussed the calls made in the Budget submission and the next steps that are needed for transitional technologies. The situation with hydrogen still needs to be resolved as it reduces emissions but does not reduce carbon, as the availibility of green hydrogen is restricted.

Members agreed that attention still needs to be focussed on today, as well as near future, as there is still action that can be taken now, and eyes need to be kept on European Union and the vehicle manufacturers.
